BLAKEY

"Lucky, lucky, lucky" is how Roy A. Blakey, 94, described his life, which ended peacefully, surrounded by love, in his Minneapolis studio home on Aug. 23, 2024.

He was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, on July 19, 1930, to Bernard and Josie Blakey, whose strong roots helped give him wings to follow his bliss — professional figure skating, traveling the world and photographing both.

Roy's love of skating was inspired by ice skating Olympic champion and movie star Sonja Henie, but lack of an ice rink turned him into a champion roller skater.

Drafted in the Army, he was sent to Germany in 1952, where he taught himself figure skating, eventually landing his first professional job performing in an ice show in Garmisch at the Casa Carioca, a U.S. military nightclub.

Returning to America to study photography, Roy landed a job skating in the Conrad Hilton Hotel's Boulevard Room in Chicago, performing there for five years before traveling twice around the world with Holiday on Ice International.

Roy honed his photography skills by making portraits of fellow skaters. Roy's camera got him detained for questioning in Russia, enabling him to photograph royal dignitaries who visited the show (including the king and queen of Thailand), and photography helped him explore his new love of Asian culture, arts and people.

In 1968, Roy settled in New York City to launch his career as a photographer to the stars of stage and screen. Debbie Allen, Blossom Dearie, Shirley MacLaine, Tommy Tune and Barry Manilow shared the limelight with downtown artists Candy Darling, Jackie Curtis and Divine — all frozen at the height of their beauty and careers in Roy's studio.

Considered a pioneer of gay male photography, Roy was a regular contributor to *After Dark* and *Dilettante* magazines. His self-published photography book of male nudes titled *HE* was the first book that featured exclusively male nudes to legally circulate via the U.S. mail after it first became legal to send nude photographs of men and not be deemed obscene by postal inspectors.

In 1993, Roy moved to Minneapolis, settling in a NYC-style loft building, sharing the studio side with his niece and fellow photographer, Keri Pickett. With additional space and nostalgic for his time in

the ice shows, Roy resumed collecting the history of theatrical figure skating, a hobby he started when he was 11 years old. Roy Blakey's IceStage Archive is now the largest treasure trove of costumes, posters, programs and memorabilia from the ice show world — ranging from Henie's shows to Ice Follies, Ice Capades, Holiday on Ice and Disney On Ice.

Roy's career and collection helped inspire and inform Pickett's documentary feature film, *The Fabulous Ice Age*, covering the century of the great American touring ice shows and Roy's efforts to save its history. Keri is currently in production on a documentary chronicling his extraordinary life titled *Uncle Roy*.

Roy is survived by his sister, B.J. French of Key West and Minneapolis, along with her daughters and Roy's nieces, Kim Mahling of Senegal, West Africa, and Arlington, Virginia, and Keri Pickett of Minneapolis.

BROADBENT

Skate sharpener pioneer Sidney "Sid" Broadbent passed away on Aug. 10, 2024, at the age of 102.

Sid, who designed a sophisticated ice skate sharpener that he called the Incredible Edger, sharpened the blades of countless skaters over decades, including Olympians. He was world renowned in the skating community for his technical expertise.

He was born an uncle in Maidenhead, England, to an older father with seven sons and a mother with five children. This extended family lived in a home with no electricity, no telephone and no refrigerator. Nor was there a car — that could explain his love of roller skating which eventually led to his expertise in ice skating.

At the age of 13, Sid was given a handsaw for his birthday; at 14, his first lathe. Being mechanically minded and needing to help earn wages for the family, he worked at a machine shop, while also going to technical school at night. At this young age, he was awarded a scholarship to attend art school and was proud when his drawing was selected to be exhibited in the school. At the age of 26, he passed the exams of the Institute of Mechanical Engineers



and became a professional engineer.

During World War II, he worked on aircraft and radar, designing the rearview mirror for the Spitfire aircraft. He joined the Home Guard in England and was responsible for extinguishing incendiary bombs and was a dispatch rider for air raid alert duty.

In the early 1950's, Sid left England for Canada, arriving in Montreal then moving to Toronto where he worked on the Avro Arrow until the Canadian government canceled the project and fired all 14,000 employees in a day.

Ice skating became his passion with his newfound free time, and he met his future wife, Barbara, on a blind date. At this time in 1958, the opportunity to purchase a plot of land on the Severn River in Muskoka became available, and he jumped on it sight unseen. He put his energy and last funds into building a cottage with no road and no electricity to aid his efforts. It became his favorite place on earth, and he spent many summers there with his family.

Sid and Barbara were married and moved to Columbus, Ohio, where their daughter, Gail, was born in 1960. He worked for North American Aviation until their move to California for a few years, and on to Colorado in 1969, where he was hired as an aerospace engineer for Martin Marietta, working on projects such as the Viking Lander and solar arrays for Saudi Arabia.

Retiring early from Martin Marietta after 13 years, he began to develop his own small business which expanded on his interest in ice skating, combining his mechanical expertise, skating experience and artistry to design the most elegant, sophisticated ice skate sharpener on the market, which he called the Incredible Edger.

The business, Iceskate Conditioning Equipment, has sold more than 2,000 machines worldwide, from South Africa to Iceland, affording him the opportunity to travel and visit customers. Many Olympic skaters have had their skates sharpened on his machines.

In 1987, Sid was awarded a grant from the United States Olympic Committee which funded his Skateology lab, measuring co-efficients of friction for skate blades and luge runners on ice. And in 2011, he received the Frank J. Zamboni award for "outstanding and innovative contributions to the ice skating industry."

Sid is survived by his daughter Gail Firmin (William) and his two grandchildren, Michael Firmin and Rachel F. Scott.

CARROLL

Coaching legend Frank Carroll passed away on June 9, 2024, after a battle with cancer. He was 85.

Carroll, whose coaching career spanned 60 years, helped guide many of the sport's greatest athletes, including Olympic champion Evan Lysacek and World champions Michelle Kwan and Linda Fratianne.

All told, he coached one Olympic champion, six Olympic medalists and 11 Olympians from five countries at 10 Olympics. He coached three World champions, four World Junior champions and six U.S. champions. He was inducted into the U.S. Figure Skating Hall of Fame in 1996.

Carroll trained champions in the 6.0 scoring system before and after the end of compulsory figures, and he coached champions under the international judging system. He retired from coaching on Aug. 3, 2018, 23 days past his 80th birthday.

1938-2024

"What Frank and his team created over the years is remarkable, and I feel privileged to have been part of it," 2002 Olympic bronze medalist and Carroll pupil Tim Goebel said in a story by Phil Hersh in SKATING magazine upon the coach's retirement.

"He showed many times that a coach can take a skater from their very first steps to an Olympic podium," Olympic champion Scott Hamilton said in the SKATING story. "He weathered every storm with class, elegance and incredible quality. He was passionate yet unflappable, instilling the qualities he experienced from the golden age of skate to create modern champions."

"He changed the lives of every skater and parent he came across," Kwan said on the eve of Carroll's 80th birthday.

Lysacek honored Carroll after winning the 2010 Olympic title with the coveted USOC Order of Ikkos medal, which is a symbol of excellence in coaching, as represented by an athlete's achievement as an Olympic medalist.

"He (Carroll) made me believe that I could skate perfectly in the Olympics," Lysacek said after the 2010 Games. "When I first heard the results, he was the first person I thought about. ... He owns just as much or more of my Olympic gold medal as I do."

The start of Carroll's coaching career can be traced back to the Boston area and his first coach, the legendary Maribel Vinson Owen. Under Owen, Carroll learned proper technique and mental toughness.

"She taught me great discipline, about being on time, always showing up, never backing out, not saying, 'Oh, I don't feel well today,'" Carroll said of Owen. "You go to the rink and you never complain about the ice."

He also absorbed many more life lessons, on and off the ice, from his mentor. An advocate of education, Owen challenged her young pupil to gain knowledge about a multitude of subjects and pushed him to become well-read.

"She wanted to hear my Latin pronunciation, which she thought was atrocious," Carroll told SKATING in 2021.

Carroll, who graduated from Holy Cross in 1960 with a degree in sociology, passed down those lessons to his own skating pupils.

"He is an all-around great coach, who considers the full scope of skating on a kid's life. He had one eye on the prize, and the other eye on the person," Linda Leaver, coach of Olympic champion Brian Boitano, said after Carroll's retirement.

Carroll's skating career included winning junior bronze medals at the 1959 and 1960 U.S. Championships. He spent more than four years with Ice Follies before embarking on a full-time coaching career.

Several of his former clubmates, friends and coaches, including Owen and her skating daughters, Laurence and Maribel Jr., died tragically in the 1961 U.S. World Team plane crash outside of Brussels, Belgium. The Memorial Fund was created shortly thereafter, to honor those who perished and to support current Team USA athletes.

GRAHAM

Dr. Hugh C. Graham, Jr., the 22nd president of U.S. Figure Skating (1986-89), passed away on May 30, 2024. He was 90 years old.

An enduring legacy of his activist presidency was his creation of the U.S. Figure Skating Hall of Fame in 1989. The first inductions and celebratory reception took place at the 1992 U.S. Championships in Orlando, Florida, and remain a highlight at nationals each year. U.S. members of the World Figure Skating Hall of Fame were added to the new U.S. Hall of Fame, listing their original date of induction.

Dr. Graham was a competitive skater in his youth, representing the Tulsa FSC and later The SC of Boston. A Harvard College graduate, with an MD from the University of Chicago, he completed his pediatric training at the University of Oklahoma Children's Hospital. For many years he served as a clinical professor of pediatrics at the University of Oklahoma, Tulsa. And, quite naturally, he was an avid Oklahoma football fan and longtime season-ticket holder.

Dr. Graham began skating at age 7, one year after his sister, Margaret Anne, became captivated by the sport. He went on to become Midwestern junior and senior champion, U.S. novice champion as well as a bronze medalist in championship men and a two-time silver medalist in championship pairs

(with Margaret Anne).

Dr. Graham and his sister placed fifth in World pairs, (his sister also placed seventh in the World ladies event), third in North American pairs and 10th in the men's championship event at Worlds. His coaches included Gus Lussi, Maribel Vinson Owen and Cliff Thael; his summer training was in Lake Placid, New York; the Broadmoor in Colorado Springs, Colorado; St. Paul, Minnesota; and Lynn, Massachusetts.

He served 23 years on the U.S. Figure Skating Board of Directors in a variety of capacities, including four terms as vice president, and was the first vice chair of the Sports Medicine Committee. During his presidency, he started Governing Council seminars to educate delegates on their role in governance of the sport.

Dr. Graham was a World judge and referee, judging two Olympics and several World Championships and was team leader (with Franklin Nelson) at the World Championships in 1974 and the Innsbruck Olympics in 1976 and team leader (with Paul George) at the 1975 Worlds at the Broadmoor. He was also involved locally with the Tulsa FSC as a board member, officer and was chair of the 1970 U.S. Championships in Tulsa.

Other significant accomplishments during his presidency include the elimination of school figures from U.S. senior and junior competition to prepare skaters for the upcoming changes at the ISU level, and the standardization of credentials, procedures and schedules at the U.S. Championships.

Noteworthy were the president's receptions and gatherings at the U.S. Championships, Worlds in Paris, Cincinnati and Budapest and the Calgary Olympics. These events, as well as more than 12 U.S. Hall of Fame receptions at the U.S. Championships, were all planned and organized by the president's spouse, Jeannie M. Graham, who handled them with style and flair.

Dr. Graham's skating journey was shared with an extended family of officials with whom he forged a special and enduring bond. Hugh Graham, Franklin Nelson, Chuck Foster and Paul George were all national champions, all graduates of Harvard Col-

lege, and all played key roles in U.S. Figure Skating governance and leadership over the course of many years.

Dr. Graham's parents became involved as high-test judges and local test chairs and his two daughters have both been involved in U.S. Figure Skating as competitive skaters and now national singles and pairs judges. Peggy Graham is a World judge and referee (judging the 2022 Olympics) and Dana Graham is a World technical specialist (2022 World Junior Championships). Dana was also U.S. junior pairs champion with Paul Wylie, and Peggy and her dad have both served as chief referee of the U.S. Championships. Hugh's oldest child and namesake, Hugh III, inherited his smarts, good nature and quick wit. While not an international official, Hugh III was a skater as a child and capped off his skating career by driving the Zamboni for a summer in Sun Valley, Idaho.

Dr. Graham was an honorary member of U.S. Figure Skating, an honorary member of the U.S. Figure Skating Board of Directors and was inducted into the U.S. Figure Skating Hall of Fame in 2004.

MELTON

Jessica Pauline Melton, a former competitive and professional skater, coach and official, died June 17, 2024, in Steamboat Springs, Colorado. She was 43.

Jessica achieved double gold medalist levels in free skate and moves in the field; novice pairs; silver dance; and competed at the sectional and national levels in senior free skate and adult synchronized skating.

She performed as a principal skater on Royal Caribbean's Voyager of the Seas, Disney's 75 Years of Magic on Ice, Star on Ice — a tour in Thailand, and with Shipstad Entertainment, performing in the U.S. and Mexico.

Jessica was a member of the Professional Skaters Association, coaching for many years before attaining certification with U.S. Figure Skating as a national technical specialist and committee member for education. One of her proudest moments was serving on the technical panel at the 2023 U.S. Figure Skating Championships in San Jose, California. Jessica always attributed her success and love of skating to her mother's unwavering support and encouragement.

Jessica obtained a bachelor's degree in psychology in 2005 from the University of Colorado at Denver, graduating with honors. She then began her career at her father's company, J.L. Melton Construction, Inc. Over time, she became vice president, co-owner and took up management of the company, building upon his previous successes. She held a Class A contractor's license and a construction management certificate from CSU. Jessica was very proud to have been a part of both of her parents' businesses throughout her life, as she started work as a 13-year-old at her mother's store, The Skater's Corner, Inc. Her work ethic never got in the way of her love of life, her gift of giving to others and her quick smile.

Jessica never took the easy road, challenging herself and those around her to do better, be better and keep looking for the next adventure. She will be remembered by loved ones for always being willing to help or lend an ear.

In celebration of her travels and her uncontainable spirit, Jessica's ashes are to be spread in some of her favorite destinations, including a secret campsite near Vail and her beloved Cozumel.



She is survived by her mother, Susan Melton of Mesa, Arizona; her father Jerry Melton of Arvada, Colorado; and her husband, Anders Olson of Arvada. She is preceded in death by her older brother, Chad William Melton. Jessica has extended family in the United States and an adopted family in Cozumel, Mexico, who mourn her passing.

MILITANO WARKMEISTER

Olympian and three-time U.S. pairs champion Melissa Militano Warkmeister, age 69, of Las Vegas, Nevada, passed away on July 16, 2024. She was 69.

Militano earned her first U.S. pairs title with brother, Mark, in 1973, and won two more with Johnny Johns in 1974 and 1975. She and her brother placed seventh at the 1972 Games in Sapporo, Japan. She competed at seven consecutive World Championships (1969-1975).

Before switching exclusively to pairs, Militano was a successful singles skater, winning the U.S. junior bronze medal in 1970 and the gold medal in the junior ranks in 1971.

Her coaches included Peter Dunfield and Ron



Ludington.

After retiring from competitive skating in 1975, Militano performed in the Ice Capades for four years.

She and husband Randy Warkmeister have one daughter, Kelly, and two grandsons.

SWANSON

Gloria Howley Swanson, a multi-event qualifier at the U.S. Figure Skating Championships and a longtime coach in New Jersey, passed away on June 7, 2024, at home in Orange, Connecticut, where she lived since September 2021.

Born Dec. 27, 1931, in Brooklyn, New York, Gloria grew up in Englewood, New Jersey. As a young girl, she trained to be a figure skater. Gloria was a Canadian gold medalist, former pairs champion and runner-up in figures, freestyle and dance competitions. She was one of a small group of people who qualified for the U.S. Championships in three events in one year.

Gloria graduated from the Barnard School for Girls in 1949 and attended Queen's University before transferring to Michigan State College, where she graduated with honors. There she met the love of her life and married Norman William Swanson in 1952. They were married for almost 69 years until Norman's death in September 2021.

After moving back to New Jersey, Gloria taught figure skating at the Fritz Dietl Ice Rink in Westwood, New Jersey, for 62 years. She influenced the lives of many young skaters, some of whom followed in her footsteps by competing in figure skating competitions, as well as becoming professional figure skaters, teaching alongside her. Others went on to become national figure skating judges.

She was amazing at crocheting, knitting and sewing, furnishing her house with drapes, table cloths and doilies among other handmade items. Gloria was a silver life master bridge player, a bridge teacher and director. She was also an EMT in River Vale, New Jersey, for five years.

Gloria was the mother of Lauren Alicia Swanson-Aprill (Robert Aprill) and Linda Beth Swanson; grandmother of Jacqueline Gardner (Alex Gardner), Theresa Bodwin, Brian Krantz and Bennett Krantz; and great-grandmother of Amelia Gardner and Emmaline Gardner.

She was predeceased by her husband and her parents, Francis and Blanche Howley.
