Description	Penalty	Who is responsible
<b>Program time violation – free dance</b> – as per <a href="#">Rules 8040</a> and <a href="#">8041</a>	-0.5 for up to every 5 sec. lacking or in excess	Referee
<b>Program time violation – pattern dance</b> – as per <a href="#">Rule 8032</a> and the Timing Chart for Skater’s Choice Pattern Dance Music	-0.5 for up to every 5 sec. in excess of permitted time after the last prescribed step in the pattern dance to the ending movement/pose	Referee
<b>Part of the costume / decoration falls on the ice</b> – as per <a href="#">Rule 8026</a>	-0.5 per program	Referee
<b>Late start</b> – as per <a href="#">Rule 1323</a> – for start between 1 and 30 seconds late	-0.5	Referee
<b>Interruption in performing the program – for every interruption</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- more than 10 sec. and up to 20 sec. interruption</li> <li>- more than 20 sec. and up to 30 sec. interruption</li> <li>- more than 30 sec. and up to 40 sec. interruption</li> </ul> An interruption is defined as the time elapsed between the moment a skater stops performing the program until the moment he resumes performing the program ( <a href="#">Rule 1403</a> )	-0.5 per interruption -1.0 per interruption -1.5 per interruption	Referee If the adverse condition can be remedied without delay, the couple does not need to report to the referee, and the music continues to play. If the couple resumes skating within 40 seconds, the referee will apply the appropriate deduction.
<b>Interruption with allowance of up to 3 minutes to resume from point of interruption – once per program</b> ( <a href="#">Rule 1403</a> )	-1.5 per program	Referee If the couple does not resume skating within 40 seconds, the referee shall instruct the music to be stopped and allow the couple three additional minutes. If the couple resumes skating within this additional period, the referee shall apply this deduction, which also covers an interruption of up to 40 seconds immediately preceding the allowance of three additional minutes.
<b>Lift exceeding permitted duration</b> – per lift exceeding <u>8</u> sec (short lift), 10 sec (choreo. lift) or <u>13</u> sec (combo. Lift)	-0.5 per lift	Referee
<b>Tempo specifications</b> – according to <a href="#">Rule 8031</a> Tempo: the tempo throughout the required sequences must be constant and in accordance with the required tempo of the pattern dance, plus or minus 2 beats per minute.	-0.5 per program	Referee
<b>Costume / prop violations</b> – as per <a href="#">Rule 8020-8026</a>	-0.5 per program	Majority deduction Referee + Judges
<b>Violation of choreographic restrictions</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Free Dance: as per <a href="#">Rule 8095 (H) separations, (J) stops and (L) touching the ice with hands</a>, unless otherwise specified in the <a href="#">U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook</a></li> </ul>	-0.5 per program	Majority deduction Referee + Judges
<b>Music requirements</b> – according to <a href="#">Rules 8031 and 8032</a> : (Rhythms): the music must be chosen in accordance with the <b>rhythm</b> of the pattern dance.	-1.0 per program	Majority deduction Referee + Judges

<p><b>Illegal Elements / Movements</b> – as per <a href="#">Rule 8108</a></p> <p>The following movements and/or poses are illegal in the free dance and in the pattern dances including the introductory and concluding steps (unless otherwise stated in the <a href="#">U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook</a>):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sitting on the partner’s head;</li> <li>Standing on partner’s shoulder;</li> <li>Lifted partner in an upside down split pose (with sustained angle between thighs more than 45 degrees)</li> <li>Lifting partner swinging the lifted partner around by holding the skate(s)/boot(s) or leg(s) only with fully extended arm(s);</li> <li>Lifting partner swinging the lifted partner around without the assistance of hand(s)/arm(s) and the lifted partner holding only with the feet around the lifting partner’s neck;</li> <li>Point of contact of the lifting hand(s)/arm(s) of the lifting partner with any part of the body of the lifted partner is sustained with fully extended arm(s) higher than the lifting partner’s head (the supporting arm may be sustained and fully extended above the head);</li> <li>Jumps of more than one (1) revolution <a href="#">except jump entry and/or jump exit</a></li> <li>Lying on the ice.</li> </ol> <p>A brief movement through poses a to f will be permitted if it is not established and sustained or if it is used only to change pose.</p>	<p><b>-1.0 per violation</b></p>	<p><b>Technical Panel</b></p> <p>Technical specialist identifies. Technical controller authorizes or corrects and deducts. If there is an illegal movement during the execution of any element, the deduction for an illegal movement will apply, and the element will receive <a href="#">a level per the requirements performed or ignored if the minimum requirements for Basic Level are not fulfilled.</a></p>
<p><b>Fall</b> <span style="float: right;">-- per fall by one partner -- per fall by both partners</span></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Kneeling or sliding on two knees or sitting on the ice is not allowed and it will be considered by the technical panel as a fall (<a href="#">Rule 1400</a>) unless otherwise specified in the <a href="#">U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook</a>.</li> <li>A fall is defined as loss of control by a skater with the result that the majority of his/her own body weight is on the ice supported by any other part of the body other than the blades e.g. hand(s), knee(s), buttock(s), or any part of the arm (<a href="#">Rule 1400</a>).</li> </ul>	<p><b>-0.5</b> <b>-1.0</b></p>	<p><b>Technical Panel</b></p>
<p><b>Extra Element</b></p> <p>If an extra element is performed in addition to the allowed number of elements from an element group in rhythm dance or free dance, to such element +ExEI will be added and the element receives a deduction.</p> <p>For example:</p> <p>If a spin(s) occurs within a step sequence (including ChSt) when not permitted, such spin(s) will be identified as extra element(s) ExEI and receive a deduction, e.g. ChSt1+ExEI.</p> <p>If a lift(s) occurs within a step sequence (including ChSt/ChRS) when not permitted or an extra lift in addition to allowed number of lifts is performed, such lift(s) will be identified as extra element(s) ExEI and receive a deduction, e.g. ChSt+ExEI, Li+ExEI.</p>	<p><b>-0.5 per element</b></p>	<p><b>Technical Panel</b> identifies the element in accordance with calling specifications.</p> <p>The technical controller advises the data operator to add to the respective element ExEI and input the respective deduction.</p>
<p><b>Element not according to the well-balanced program requirements receives (*) symbol</b></p> <p>In case there is an incorrect element performed as not according to the requirements (e.g.. CiSt instead of a required MiSt/DiSt) or the repetition rule for lifts is violated, the element will receive NO value but will NOT receive a deduction.</p>	<p>Element gets NO value but will NOT receive a deduction</p>	<p>The computer verification identifies elements not according to requirements and applies the asterisk (*). The <b>technical controller</b> verifies and authorizes the call.</p>

Symbol	Action	Explanation
<	= reduce by 1 level, interruption of 1 measure or less in PD.	If the pattern dance element is interrupted 1 measure or less (4 or 6 beats based on the PD) – the key points are called as identified, and the level will be reduced by 1. It is reported on the Judges Details per Skater chart as: “<” to indicate an interruption of 1 measure or less.
<<	= reduce by 2 levels, interruption of more than 1 measure in PD.	If the pattern dance element is interrupted more than 1 measure (4 or 6 beats based on the PD), the key points are called as identified, and the level will be reduced by 2. It is reported on the Judges Details per Skater chart as: “<<” to indicate an interruption of more than 1 measure.
>	= -0.5 deduction for extended dance lift	If the duration of the dance lift is longer than the permitted time, the referee applies the deduction of -0.5. The duration of the lift is confirmed by the referee electronically.
ExEI	= -0.5 deduction for “extra element”	<p><b>Extra Element (ExEI)</b>                      If an extra element is performed in addition to the allowed number of elements from an element group in the free dance, to such element ExEI will be added, and the element receives a deduction.</p> <p>For example:                      If a spin(s) occurs within a step sequence (including ChSt) when not permitted, such spin(s) will be identified as extra element(s) ExEI and receive a deduction, e.g., ChSt+ExEI.</p> <p>If a lift(s) occurs within a step sequence (including ChSt) when not permitted or an extra lift in addition to allowed number of lifts is performed, such lift(s) will be identified as extra element(s) ExEI and receive a deduction, e.g., ChSt+ExEI, Li+ExEI.</p>
*	Element gets NO value but will NOT receive a deduction	<p><b>Element not according to the well-balanced program requirements (*)</b>                      If an incorrect element is performed not according to the requirements (e.g., CiSt instead of a required MiSt/DiSt) or the repetition rule for lifts is violated, the element will receive NO value but will NOT receive a deduction.</p>
F	= Fall in element, -0.5 per fall per partner	If there is a fall(s) within an element, this is identified by the technical specialist as a fall in element, and the data operator pushes the respective button “Fall in Element.”
S	= reduced by 1 level, if in hold/contact/touch in SqTw	If partners are in hold/contact/touch during the sequential twizzles (FD) the level shall be reduced by 1 level (per each partner) for sequential twizzles.
!	= Choreo element is identified and does not fulfill all requirements.	- If a choreographic element is identified and does not fulfill all the requirements, it receives the “!” symbol on the judges screen, and the judges will apply the appropriate GOE per the GOE chart.
