The Championship Series – Blaine competition will be held October 4 – 8, 2021 at the National Sports Center – Super Rink and is the first of eight events of the Championship Series. Responsibilities of All Volunteers

All volunteers are responsible for showing up to their shift at the start time listed. All volunteer shifts overlap by 15 minutes to allow for training and transition time. Each volunteer is responsible for training their replacement prior to departing. Volunteers may not depart until their replacement has arrived. If your replacement has not arrived at least 5 minutes prior to the end of your shift, find the closest volunteer with a radio (usually an ice monitor) and a replacement will be provided.

Volunteer Position Overviews

Ice Monitor

Ice monitors must be on cue to open the gate to allow the skaters to enter and exit the rink for practice and competition times. Ice monitors will be stationed rink side so dress warmly.

Announcing

Using provide scripts, start and end the scheduled practice sessions at the time designated by the schedule. Figure skating announcing experience is not required.

Announcing/Music

Using provided scripts, announce the start and end of each session as well as the start of each skater's practice program. Responsible for pressing play for each skaters music in provided music order – playlists with skaters music will be provided for you. Figure skating announcing and music playing experience is not required.

Check-In & Ticket Sales

Be the first face skater's see as they arrive at the competition! You will be responsible for checking skaters into the competition as well as giving out pre-ordered ticket packages. This position does require use of computer and mobile phone systems.

Floater

This position is to help support other volunteers and event functions. As a floater, you may be temporarily relieving other volunteers, supporting communication between volunteer points, helping officials, etc.
